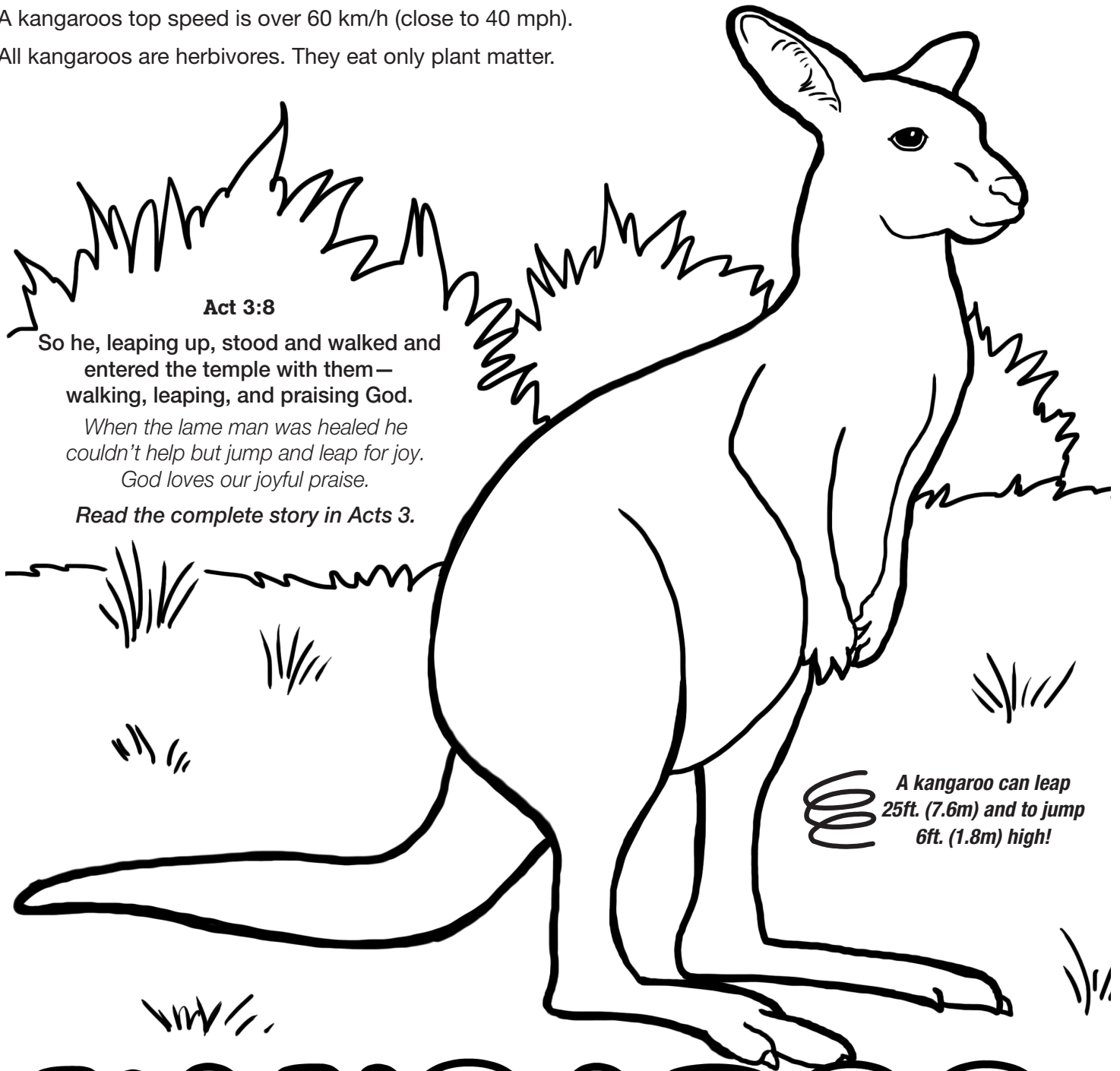


Kangaroo Fact Sheet

- Kangaroos are the largest living marsupials.
- Kangaroos are found in Australia and Tasmania, as well as on surrounding islands.
- A group of Kangaroos is called a “mob”
- Female kangaroos give birth to one “joey” at a time.
- Newborns weigh as little as 0.03 ounces at birth—as small as a lima bean!
- The adult male Kangaroo is called buck, boomer or jack.
- A kangaroo's top speed is over 60 km/h (close to 40 mph).
- All kangaroos are herbivores. They eat only plant matter.
